



ARC Architectural Review Committee

ARE YOU LIT? – Your house number sign is lit 24/7. Eventually it will go out, but it's an easy fix for anyone. Yes, anyone. Two small 5 watt 12 volt lamps provide the light for the panel. The lamps pull straight out and push straight in. When one burns out, the light goes off. Lamps are available locally, but they're five bucks each and only rated for 3000 hours. That sounds like a long time, but actually it's only four months. If you're an Amazon Prime customer, you can get ten lamps (item: 5 watt T3 ¼ quarter base clear xenon 20,000 hours) for ten bucks. Split an order with a neighbor, and you'll both be set. Installation – Using only fingers (NOT pliers or tools), pull out one lamp. If the filament is intact, reinstall it. If not, throw it away and install a new lamp. Do the same for lamp number two. If it's too difficult to see the filament, throw both old lamps away and install two new lamps. The light should come back on when you install lamp number two and you're finished! ARC meetings for May will be on the 12th and 26th.
